January BACS Zoom Demo: White Line Woodcuts with Kate Hanlon



On January 16 at 6:45 p.m., Kate Hanlon will present an overview of

printmaking approaches via Zoom. The heart of her talk will feature a demonstration of white line woodcut techniques. Rather than creating separate woodblocks for each color,

white line printers make and paint one block only. Small groves between the elements of the design create the white line. Kate is an experienced teacher and multifaceted artist, and her demo is sure to inform and please! Again, this presentation will take place via Zoom. 




Perfection of Summer, acrylic painting by Sylvia Mallory from the Chelmsford show

The exhibition reveals the liberties Sargent took with their attire to express distinctive personalities, social positions, professions, gender identities, and nationalities. Alongside about 50 paintings by Sargent, over a dozen period garments and accessories shed light on the relationship between fashion and this beloved artist's creative practice.
