BACS Members' Work on Exhibit


Florence Como (acrylic painting), Sylvia Mallory (photography), Yvonne Sandell (watercolor



Work must be original, created in the last three years, and not shown before in the library. 2-D work must be framed and ready for hanging with wire. Two entries per artist are allowed.

Notification of acceptance will be on Sunday, March 5, at 5:00 p.m. A reception is planned on Sunday, March 19, 5:00–6:00 p.m.

"Putting Black Women on the Map: Then and Now" at the Lexington Arts and Crafts Society (LexArt) through February 26

In collaboration with LexSeeHer, whose mission is to make women visible, "Putting Black Women on the Map" pays tribute to the contributions made by black women across 300+ years of Lexington history. The exhibition examines the legacies of **Margaret Tulip**, a freed but then re-enslaved slave, who



went to court to win back her freedom; **Phebe Banister Burdoo**, a free woman of color whose son fought in the Battle of Lexington; and **Mary Elizabeth Miles Bibb**, an abolitionist, educator, and journalist who was the first African American woman to graduate from the Lexington Normal School. Celebrating Valentine's Day

Jim Dine (b. 1935) is a versatile American artist whose oeuvre extends over sixty years. His work includes painting, drawing, printmaking, sculpture, and photography.

Four Hearts is a Pop Art screen print. At the core of Dine's art, regardless of the medium of the specific work, lies an autobiographical exploration and a criticism of self through

various personal motifs. These images include

the heart (as in this featured work), the bathrobe, tools, antique sculpture, and even the character of Pinocchio! One commentator described the artist's approach as all-encompassing and noted, "Dine's art has a stream of consciousness quality to its evolution and is based on all aspects of his life—what he is reading, objects he comes upon in souvenir shops around the world, a serious study of art from every time and place that he understands as being useful to his own practice."
