# One of our featured activities for the holiday season

On December 7 **Laura Wallace** will do a repeat of her ever-popular workshop on making an elegant holiday candle. The finished, simple block candle measures about 5". Each crafter will use one box of Gulf canning wax and will cut a groove for the wick, then stick the blocks together with melted wax and finally "frost" the candle with cooling wax, adding glitter if desired. ## **November Nostalgia**

This bustling scene of women preparing a Thanksgiving feast, by American artist **Doris Lee**, became the object of national headlines when it was first exhibited at the Art Institute of Chicago in 1935 and won the prestigious Logan Purchase Prize. The themes of Thanksgiving, rural customs, and family life, which Lee painted in a deliberately folksy manner, would have had great appeal to a country still in the midst of the Great Depression. Yet Josephine Logan, the donor of the prize, condemned the work's broad, exaggerated style, founding the conservative "Sanity in Art" movement in response. This controversy only brought Lee fame, and her painting *Thanksgiving* has been recognized as one of the most popular nostalgic views of this American ritual since that time. *(Text courtesy of the Art Institute of Chicago)*
